Application

Make sure your application is complete, your study agreement signed, and all the documents have been submitted which include copy of the passport or ID card, recent ID photo, copy of your highest diploma and certificate of health insurance.

Recognition of equivalence of your previous diploma: LUNEX will take care of the mandatory recognition of your previous diploma by the Luxembourgish authorities. For this, you will need to fill a form, provide a power of attorney and a CV in europassformat.

Visa application required?

If you are an international student, please check in advance whether a visa is required for you. Non-EU students must apply for a student visa. Our team will guide you through the process. Please keep in mind that the visa application process can take several months. More information is available here: → lunex.lu/contact-service/information-for-international-students

Financial aid

As a private institution, we are not funded by the state but by the tuition fees. If you don't have the financial resources, you can find out about available financial aid and scholarships. If you are not eligible for the above options, you can still ask for a student loan or look for a student job. More information is available in this guide. Non-EU students will need to prove that they have sufficient funding to cover tuition fees and living expenses.

Health insurance

A copy of your health insurance will be mandatory to finalise your application at LUNEX. As a European student, you just have to ask your health insurance provider at home for a certificate. Non-EU students can apply for health insurance with a Luxembourgish health insurance provider. Once enrolled at LUNEX, you will also have the possibility to register for the CNS ("Caisse Nationale de Santé") in Luxembourg.

Accommodation

At the moment, LUNEX does not offer accommodation on its campus but is actively working on it. Thus, you will need to look for accommodation before the semester starts. Please keep in mind that accommodation hunting in Luxembourg is highly competitive and expensive. A few tips are available in the following pages of this guide.

ECTS recognition: Accreditation of prior learning

Have you already started your studies? Validated some ECTS? Then, you have the possibility of requesting the accreditation of prior learning, which would enable you to validate some ECTS in advance and avoid having to take certain modules during your studies at LUNEX.

To request it, please send us the following documents by e-mail:

1. A CV, specifying your educational or professional background.
2. A copy of your diplomas and where you obtained your bachelor's degree.
3. A detailed transcript which shows all modules/courses taken, including grades achieved, and the exact content.
4. For each module/course, a short description of the total number of European credits (ECTS) and hours associated.

All the above documents have to be submitted in English. For official documents, a professional translation is required.

Financial aid and scholarships

If you do not have the financial resources, you can apply for a scholarship in your home country. International scholarships are also available. These may be provided by associations, foundations, companies and other organisations and institutions.

Students can also apply for the AIDEFI scholarship in Luxembourg. The application is entirely done online via MyGuichet and is subject

to various requirements. You can find the application process, deadline and requirements below:

In addition, LUNEX offers funding for professional athletes.

Students who compete as athletes at a professional level can obtain the student-athlete status and may benefit from a scholarship.

AIDEFI Scholarship – Attention:

For students residing outside of Luxembourg, financial aid is a form of substitute assistance. Before submitting their application, these students must have completed all the necessary steps in their country of residence to obtain financial aid for their studies in Luxembourg.

Students must also respect the application deadlines in their country of residence. The official answer, positive or negative, for the current academic year must be attached to the application for financial aid in Luxembourg. Without this response from the competent authorities in the country of residence, financial aid cannot be granted.

Healthcare insurances

Every student enrolled at LUNEX must contract health insurance. If you are from an EU country, European Economic Area or Switzerland, you can use your European health Insurance card.

However, if you are resident of Luxembourg, you must apply to the CCSS (Centre Commun de la Sécurité Sociale) for mandatory student health insurance to be reimbursed for your healthcare expenses. More information here:

You will just need to join an enrolment certificate to the application. For non-EU students, to facilitate the procedures, LUNEX offers the service to contract the insurance for you to the CCSS at the start of the semester. The form will be filled in in the Study Service Office and send directly to the CCSS. Once it's accepted, the institution will pay monthly for the health insurance. At the end of every semester, you will receive an invoice to pay back the institution (the expenses are around 100 euros per month). Before your arrival, you can contract insurance (usually travel insurance covering your medical costs).

If you are enrolled with social security, you will receive a social security card to prove your entitlement to the CNS.

Rental insurances

When you rent an apartment or room in Luxembourg, we advise you to contract rental insurance as an occupant to cover your household contents. It's not mandatory but in the event of fire or water, you will be required to bear all repair costs... so better be covered. Sometimes, the insurance can be included in your rent, you need to check in your contract.

As a student, you can even contract rental insurance with advantages (multi-risk home insurance).

Required documents for renting an apartment or shared apartment:

- ID card/Passport
- Scholarship enrollment
- Proof of income (from you or your parents: the last 3 pay slips or employment contract)
- Bank details (RIB)
- Garant or designation (to cover possible damages or

non-payment. For non-EU students, it can be your sponsor)

• VISA (for non-EU students)

• Rental insurance (if the landlord asks for it)

To rent an apartment, you need to draw up a written rental agreement (called "Bail" in French) with an agency or landlord.

In this contract, important aspects of the agreement between you and the landlord will be set out like duration of the contract, the amount of rent, the schedule and frequency of the payments, the amount of the deposit (called "caution" which usually equals the amount of 3 months of rent), the notice periods (usually 3 months before leaving the apartment you have to send a registered letter to the landlord to notice your departure). When you sign the "bail" you should do the inventory check as well.

The inventory check is not mandatory, but it will be useful to prove that you haven't damaged the apartment when you want to leave the place in order to get back the amount of your deposit.

Opening a bank account

Depending on your situation, you may need to open a bank account in Luxembourg. In the area, you can find different bank offices such as:

- Spuerkeess (BCEE)
- BNP BGL Paribas
- Raiffeisen
- BIL
- ING

It can be tricky to open a bank account depending on your situation. You need to wait until you have an accommodation.

Check with your bank in your current country if they don't have a branch in Luxembourg. Sometimes it does facilitate the procedures.

Required documents to open a bank account:

- ID card/Passport
- Scholarship enrollment
- Proof of address (rental agreement)
- Residence permit (for non-EU students)

Phone subscription

If you are planning to stay for a long time in Luxembourg, you may need a phone subscription. Depending on the operator you choose and your needs, it goes from 20 euros to 80 euros per month on average.

These are the main agencies where you can go:

Required documents for a phone subscription:

- ID card/Passport
- Proof of address (invoice at your current address or rental agreement. It depends if you buy a pre-paid phone or subscription)
- Bank details (RIB if you choose an automatic debit)
- Visa or Residence permit (for non-EU students)





3. Welcome to Luxembourg: Additional information for international students

Visa application for international students

If you are a future student at LUNEX and you are from a third country, you will need to request a temporary authorisation to stay and then a student permit.

First of all, please check if you have a valid passport and if you need to obtain a VISA to enter the Schengen area:

1. Temporary authorisation to stay / Authorisation to study
2. VISA (If required)
3. Declaration of arrival (within 3 days of arrival to the commune where you will stay)
4. Medical Check-up (GP and TB screening)
5. Residence permit application (within the 3 months of arrival)

Step 1:

If you are accepted in one of our study programmes, LUNEX will apply for a temporary authorisation to stay for you to the Immigration Directorate of the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs. More information:

Once your request is accepted, we will receive your "temporary authorisation to stay" at LUNEX. Your authorisation is valid 90 days. During that time, from your country of origin you have to apply for a VISA (staying for more than 3 months: Type D) in person, to the Luxembourg diplomatic mission or the embassy which represents Luxembourg in your country (Belgian embassy). Visa type D is valid one year maximum.

Step 2:

After entering the country, you have to make a declaration of arrival at the administration of the commune where you want to establish your residence within 3 days of your arrival in Luxembourg.

To obtain your residence permit, you must have completed a medical check-up:

- By a General Practitioner in Luxembourg. If you don't know where to go, you can find one on → doctena.lu
- A TB screening (Tuberculosis Test by the Ligue médico-sociale LMS). To take an appointment, you can visit this website: → ligue.lu



After receiving the results, the Immigration Medical Department will give a medical certificate which will be sent directly to the Ministry to allow the residence permit application.

Then, you must submit an application for a residence permit (for students) to the Immigration Directorate of the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs. This can be done by sending the required documents by email or submitting the application on My Guichet

Once it's approved by the organism, you will receive a letter inviting you to take an appointment with the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs to take a picture and fingerprints for your permit. A few days after, you will be able to pick it up in person by appointment.

With your residence permit, as a student, you are allowed to work on average 15 hours per week.

Don't forget to renew your Residence permit two months before the expiration date!

Required documents to complete your application:

- A copy of the entire valid passport
- Birth certificate
- Where applicable, a copy of the residence permit issued in another EU Member State if the applicant already resides in the Schengen area
- An extract from the applicant's criminal record or an affidavit (sworn oath if no police clearance certificate can be issued) established in the applicant's country of residence
- Proof of admission to a university in Luxembourg (here: to LUNEX)
- Proof of sufficient financial resources to cover living expenses and return travel. (80% of the minimal social income).
Currently it is around 17.000 Euros for 1 year. Around 1.420 Euros per month plus tuition fees. But this is subject to change.

This proof can be provided in the following manner:

1. by providing the original document of the certificate of scholarship or student loan stating the amount and duration or
2. by providing an original bank certificate as well as a bank statement

from the past six months, in order to prove that...

... you have the necessary resources yourself or

... your parents are solvent and able to cover living expenses including tuition fees, healthcare costs for at least one year (twelve months) as well as return travel costs

Foreign Driving Licence Conversion

If you have a driving licence from other EEA Member States, it is recognized in Luxembourg. If not, you will need to convert your driving license:

- Licences can be converted, at the earliest, 185 days after you have moved to Luxembourg.
- Failure to convert within a year requires passing a driving test.

To complete the application, you will need the following documents:

- An ID photo (45 x 35 mm).
- A medical certificate (within 3 months).
- Criminal record extract (no more than 3 months old) from the country of origin covering the last 5 years
- A EUR 30 tax stamp.
- A photocopy of the foreign licence and valid ID.
- Bulletin n°4 from Luxembourg criminal records (within 3 months).

Do you know?

All students, regardless of nationality, are allowed to work during their studies, during their school holidays and/or throughout the year.

Students can either:

- Work 40hours/week with a student contract during school holidays
- Work 15hours/week with a fixed-term contract (CDD)

Tip:

Having a student job gives you advantages such the automatic registration to the CCSS (Centre commun de la sécurité sociale) by your employer.

Public transport in Luxembourg and car park near LUNEX

Public Transport:

In Luxembourg, public transport is free since 1 March 2020, which include train, tram, and bus.

Train stations:

The closest train station from LUNEX is "Oberkorn, Gare" (5 minutes walking from LUNEX). Behind the building of Aquasud, you will find a path going directly towards the train station. There is also a second train station "Differdange, Gare", right in front of Auchan Opkorn (15 minutes walking from LUNEX).

You may use the train to go to Belval, Esch-sur-Alzette, or to Luxembourg-City.

Local bus in Differdange:

The bus stop near LUNEX is Oberkorn/Aquasud. The local bus of Differdange runs every 30 minutes, from 07:00 to 19:00.
